## **3. EEO Dept. Head Meeting/Training to Management**

General Manager, Kristy Santiago met with the Department Heads on July 26, 2019 to discuss the need for broad recruitment practices and the need to pay close attention to the station's recruitment practices and other EEO obligations to ensure compliance with the FCC's EEO rules.

## **4. Educational Institutions**

Beginning in October and continuing monthly throughout the school year, the station sponsors Classroom Makeover. Each month viewers nominate a teacher/class that exemplifies excellence in education. The winner receives \$500 to use in the classroom. Evening anchors Amanda Gomez and Aaron Groff make the award each month to the teacher and students. PSAs are aired to promote the importance of schools and education in our communities. Jeff Mitchell, Local Sales Manager, or Account Representative Janet Gudgel attend each award presentation

8/28/2018 - Eight students from the Digital Media Academy of Everett Alvarez High School toured KION TV to get a first-hand look of professional journalists at work. Managing Editor Mary Coleman directed the tour of the station facility as reporters, anchors, directors and editors answered questions about the education required to become a journalist, as well as the daily duties that a working journalist confronts.



9/20/18 – General Manager Kristy Santiago and Account Representative Lori Magdaleno represented the station at the Hartnell College Foundation’s annual Women’s Education and Leadership Institute Forum. This event brings together business and community leaders to support and promote economic prosperity for women in the Salinas Valley through higher education

12/6/2018 - Managing Editor Mary Coleman hosted a second visit from the Digital Media Academy at Everett Alvarez High School. This was a much larger group of 19 students. Many had an interest in the path to become a journalist. Coleman answered many questions on her behind-the-scenes tour of making a newscast including how production careers play a role in putting a broadcast on the air.

01/07/2019 - CW Anchor Zach Fuentes hosted career day at North Salinas High School. He talked about his own career and his education and shared with high school students interested broadcast television jobs the best ways to break into the profession

2/20/2019 – KION-TV Morning Reporter Victor Guzman visited the Mission Trails ROP Center. The Center is a vocation program that offers Salinas Union High School District students specialized instruction in the fields of nursing, auto mechanics and broadcast journalism. He spoke in front of two classes of high school students about the challenges of being a multi-media journalism as well as the education required for the position.

Santa Catalina is a private school in Monterey founded by Sister Margaret Thompson and the Dominican Order in 1950.
