On May 24, 1996, a Cal Poly student, Kristin Smart, went missing after attending a fraternity party off campus. Another Cal Poly student, Paul Flores, walked with Ms. Smart back to the dorms. In 2021, the San Luis Obispo District Attorney charged Paul Flores with murder and that the murder was committed while the defendant was engaged in the commission of, or attempting to commit, the crime of rape. Paul Flores's father, Ruben Flores, was charged with being an accessory after the fact.

This is NOT a death penalty case and there are no gang allegations.

1. This case is expected to last through the beginning of October 2022. Trial will be conducted between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and between 10:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays. There will be breaks in the morning and afternoon and the lunch hour will be from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. each day. There may be occasional portions of the trial during which the jury will not be required. Court will not be in session on: July 5, 2022; July 27, 2022 - July 29, 2022 and August 22, 2022 – August 23, 2022.
